Students will be spaced 3 ft. apart to the greatest extent practical. Bright Spot Preschool & Kindergarten will consider the guidance from the CDC and Montgomery County Health Department should conditions necessitate further mitigation strategies. Bright Spot Preschool & Kindergarten staff will teach and reinforce frequent and proper hand washing and covering coughs and sneezes among students. All staff and students are to wash hands before and after snacks, after use of the restroom, and when returning from outside. Hand sanitizer will be available |
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| d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation; | Classrooms and high touch surfaces will be cleaned daily. Disinfect areas used by any individual who tested positive or is considered a close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. |

e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;

Bright Spot Preschool & KIndergarten will report all confirmed cases of COVID-19 to the Montgomery County Health Department.

The staff will assist the Montgomery County Health Department in contact tracing as needed.

Close Contact - Someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period (for example, three individual 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes). An infected person can spread SARS-CoV-2 starting from 2 days before they have any symptoms (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days before the positive specimen collection date), until they meet criteria for discontinuing home isolation.

Close Contact Exception: In the indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) if both the infected student and the exposed student(s) correctly and consistently wore well-fitting masks the entire time. This exception does not apply to teachers, staff, or other adults in the indoor classroom setting.

All students and staff must follow isolation/quarantine guidelines as provided by Montgomery County Health Department and as recommended by CDC including factors related to masking, social distancing, and COVID-19 vaccination and symptoms
